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## **Outerlimits Celebrates in Style at their Anniversary Bash and Poker Run**

The poker run consisted of an 85-mile course along Narragansett Bay and the Sakonnet River. As the engines fired up and everyone took their places, the air was filled with excitement and anticipation. The boats took off from J.G.Goffs in downtown Bristol and headed towards Providence. The first stop was at India Point Park in Providence then on to Newport to a 63 foot Sunseeker to pick up card number 2. The group then took off to the Sakonnet River, where all 22 boats rafted up with a 130-foot mega-yacht for a gourmet lunch and card number 3. After lounging around a bit, everyone headed to Battleship Cove in Fall River for card number 4 and then returned to Bristol for card

number 5 and to party the night away. The day ended with a dinner buffet, complete with an ice sculpture, the awards ceremony, a great band and many Outerlimits tales.

This was a special event for Outerlimits owners. A gathering where the camaraderie was evident and everyone could share their Outerlimits stories, experiences, and just maybe, see who really was the fastest.
